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SpicE is a project that aims to enhance **Primary Education Teachers' ability to implement effective STEAM instruction to facilitate Mild Disabilities students' educational and social inclusion.**

It seeks to remove barriers for a significant number of students that are silently, slowly, and indirectly marginalized from the early stages of European school systems due to the lack of Teachers' STEAM skills and the lack of a methodological liaison (along with practical guidelines and curricula) between STEAM education and Special Education educational models.

The project's **specific objectives** include

- Developing a **Competence and Education framework** for STEAM education in Special Education targeting primary education teachers
- Designing an innovative Joint STEAM **Curriculum** for Special Education targeting primary education teachers
- Developing a STEAM **Training Programme** for Special Education
- **Piloting and evaluating** the STEAM Training Programme for Special Education
- Creating and nurturing a sustainable **Community of Practice** in STEAM for Special Education



The main outcomes of the project

- Improve the teacher education policies and practices in Europe for students with mild disabilities
- Enhance the European dimension and internationalization of teacher education
- Develop different models of mobility, as well as a sustainable collaboration.
